

Missions

Missionary of the Month: Pastor Ayub - Serving with the Presbyterian Church of Bangladesh (PCB)

The Presbyterian Church of Bangladesh (PCB) is a small denomination that began in 2009 in a country with only .3% Christians and 91% Muslims. They have around 20 formal churches, with 90 cell groups. The 3 pillars of the church are 1) church leadership training, 2) its Gospel Reformation Study Center, and 3) Christian literature. Pastor Ayub has written and translated more than 40 books. One of his first translations was Louis Berkhof's Systematic Theology, and most recently he translated the Westminster Larger Catechism. Those who lead cell groups are expected to share the gospel with 40 people every month using the basic Evangelism Explosion (EE) structure, as well as their own PCB books and tracts. The study center is an institution designed to train Christians as disciple makers and build churches among the Bangla-speaking Muslim population. Courses are open to both Muslims and Christians in order to fairly and thoroughly teach orthodox Islam and Reformed Christianity in an objective way. PCB church planters should also know the Constitution of Bangladesh, civil law, Christian law, biblical and Reformed doctrine, apologetics, and ethics in order to both defend and promote their faith with Muslims.

Pray for:

- Gratia Children's Home this home raises children from poor families and orphans from PCB's congregations. They currently have 18 children in the program and are expecting 13 more orphans in January.
- Couples Camp begun this year, the objective is to equip families for working in the field as church planters. The curriculum provides training on how to lead cell groups. Church planting is currently going on in 18 different locations, and 3 new fields will be opened this month.
- 3. PCB Mission School The school was established to provide quality education to the local community in English from nursery through grade 5, and in Bangla from grades 6-8. This was to fulfill their cultural mandate to be good neighbors and to provide some income for PCB programs. They want to complete their building by December, and add grades 9-10.

Pray for our country, and our state and federal leaders. Pray for our grieving families.

*Elsie Haines: Elsie was hospitalized last weekend with extremely low hemoglobin. She received a couple of blood transfusions (among other treatments) and is feeling much, much better now. The doctors will continue to follow up with her to figure out what may have caused this to happen. Elsie is in good spirits and the Haines family all feel so loved by their church family! Thank you all so much!

*Mark Freed: Mark has been receiving chemotherapy treatment for Stage 4 Colorectal Cancer over the past 11 months. As the cancer adapts to the treatment and becomes less effective, his doctor is investigating new treatment plans, including a promising clinical trial. Please pray for wisdom for the doctors as they evaluate the next stage of his treatment, including acceptance into the right clinical trial, and complete healing of his cancer.

Laurie Clement's grandnephew, Joshua: Baby Joshua was finally able to go home on Monday. Thank you for your prayers for his health. Pray now for the family as they adjust.

Mark Rusinko: Mark fell off a ladder on October 20th and fractured his heel and cannot bear any weight on his foot. Please pray for healing, less pain, more mobility, and for him to get up the stairs soon. Pray also for energy and patience for Jan.

Jeab Webber's grandmother, Yupa: Pray for my grandma, Yupa. She is home from the hospital and recovering. She has no concussion from falling but has aches and bruises. She needed to be healed from shingles and be encouraged from not being well (she had been discouraged from being sick and having low energy). Thank you for your love and for praying for her.

Worship in Submission to God's Word

A Call to Faith and Patience

Hebrews 6:4-12

⁴ For it is impossible, in the case of those who have once been enlightened, who have tasted the heavenly gift, and have shared in the Holy Spirit, ⁵ and have tasted the goodness of the word of God and the powers of the age to come, 6 and then have fallen away, to restore them again to repentance, since they are crucifying once again the Son of God to their own harm and holding him up to contempt. ⁷For land that has drunk the rain that often falls on it, and produces a crop useful to those for whose sake it is cultivated, receives a blessing from God. 8 But if it bears thorns and thistles, it is worthless and near to being cursed, and its end is to be burned. ⁹Though we speak in this way, yet in your case, beloved, we feel sure of better things – things that belong to salvation. ¹⁰ For God is not unjust so as to overlook your work and the love that you have shown for his name in serving the saints, as you still do. 11 And we desire each one of you to show the same earnestness to have the full assurance of hope until the end, 12 so that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises.
